Reception to Year 6 - Out of Hours Club

- Advanced notice will be required to book your child into a club, this will no longer be 24 hours.

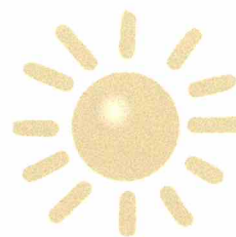
When children return back to school after the May half term, the Out of Hours Club, for both After School Club and Breakfast Club will need to be booked in advance, this will ensure adequate staffing is in place.

The online booking system is moving to a weekly cut off system, so all bookings will need to be made the week before the day/s you wish to reserve. The online booking service will close every Friday at 12:00 in readiness for the up and coming week.

We encourage all parents to book in advance, where possible half termly at a time. The Out Of Hours club is becoming increasingly busy and places are in demand. Booking in advance will help to secure a space.

Prepare for Summer

The weather is warming up so children should come to school well prepared, wearing sunscreen and bringing in suitable sun hats. Please label all of your children's items with their names including school uniforms. At this time of year, children take off cardigans and jumpers and our lost property gets very full. Without children's names we cannot return them and this can be very costly for parents.



Reporting absence & lateness

Please be reminded that children's absence should be reported first thing in the morning before 8.30am. If you leave a voicemail message, please ensure you state your child's full name, class and the reason for the absence. The school day starts at 8.30am, please be aware that lateness also impacts children's attendance records. Children should be ready to start school at 8.30am, we are seeing an increased number of children entering school via the office. Again, this impacts children attendance records and can disrupt the start of their day.

Contact Details & Pupil Information

It is important that the school has up to date and accurate information regarding contact information and home address information. If there is a change of details please notify the school as soon as possible by completing a 'change of details' form which you can obtain from the school office. If your child's medical details, allergy information or dietary needs change, please notify the school. Often we do require information in writing so that we can fully understand and support your child's individual needs.

At Waulud Primary School, we are committed to providing a safe, respectful, and professional environment for our students, teachers, and support staff. While we understand that discussions regarding your children can occasionally be emotional, we maintain a zero-tolerance policy toward intimidation or verbal abuse.

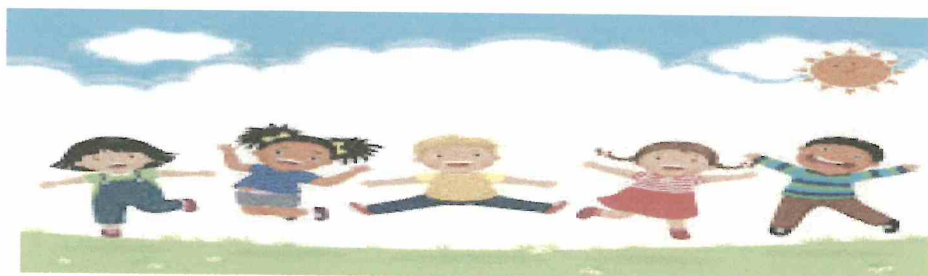
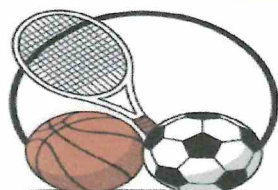

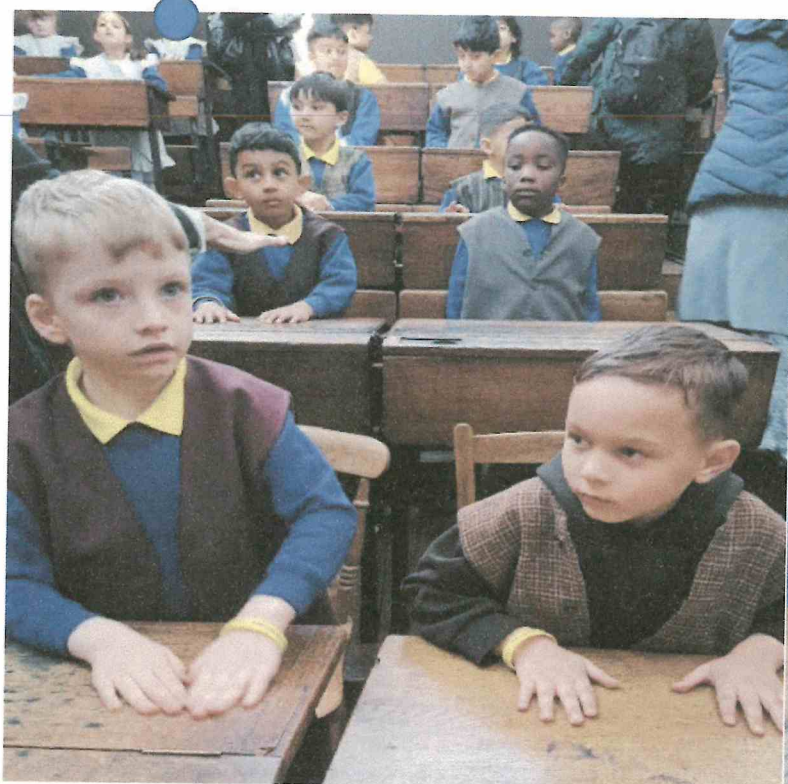
Year 2 Walton on the Naze
